(a) Crime Figures

The crime figures for November 2019, show 46 reported crimes through the Parish, this compares with 56 for the same period in 2018. The 2019 figures include 10 – Anti-Social Behaviour, 4 – Criminal Damage / Arson, 18 – Violence, 5 - Public Order, 1 – Theft of or from Vehicles, 3 – Other Theft, 1 – Burglary, 3 – Other Crime and 1 Drugs

The crime figures for December 2019, show 50 reported crimes through the Parish, this compares with 56 for the same period in 2018. The 2019 figures include 15 – Anti-Social Behaviour, 5 – Criminal Damage / Arson, 14 – Violence, 3 - Public Order, 3 – Theft of or from Vehicles, 2 – Other Theft, 4 – Burglary, 1 – Other Crime, 2 Robbery, 1 Drugs

The Clerk gave a verbal update of the Community Centre Committee Meeting held on 11 February 2020 In a walk round of building it was discussed that the Emergency Light above side door needs replacing, in-house work has taken place to combat damp ingress in the hall, the outside wall has been treated with a sealant and the interior wall has had damp paint removed to allow drying. The inside will be damp treated in the next couple of weeks.

The committee looked at the Refurbishment of the hiring rooms with the aim of Improving the hiring spaces to improve bookings, in particular family parties.

Bar Room quotes are to be sought for following: Installation of six wall lights, installation of LED panel lighting, removal of carpet and installation of universal wood flooring, redecoration of wall and purchase of multi-functional furniture to make the space more inviting

Main Hall quotes to be sought for the following: Painting bottom part of hall, painting entire hall; replacement of curtains and installation of basic PA System
