(a) **Crime Figures**

The Crime Figures for January 2021 are 81, compared to 67 for the same period in 2020 and 43 in 2019. The crimes include 29 incidents of anti-social behaviour, 7 criminal damage, 19 violence, 6 public order, 1 theft of or from vehicles, 1 burglary, 11 other crime, 3 shoplifting and 4 drugs.

The Crime Figures for February 2021 are 49, compared to 33 for the same period in 2020 and 43 in 2019. The crimes include 21 incidents of anti-social behaviour, 4 criminal damage, 19 violence, 2 public order, 2 theft of or from vehicles, 1 other theft.

(c) Community Centre

The Clerk reported that the drain engineers have been out and carried out inspections, a quote is awaited for further works. The foyer has been painted and the bar room floor completed. A contractor has been found to professionally clean the carpets and will test the area outside the kitchen first. Whilst the painting was taking place it was found that a number of radiators require replacing, the contractors have been out and a quote is awaited.

(d) Children's Grant

The Council received a Children's Grant in 2019 from the Awards for All Lottery Fund. £7600 was for Holiday Clubs – organised by Brimington Junior School and £2200 was for a Toddler Group in the Community Centre

We have now been approached to house a mother and toddler messy play group. They are booked into the Bar Room for two 1.5 hour sessions per week. They are hoping to have enough numbers to move into the Main Hall by September 2021. Council are asked to consider approval of a £550.00 grant (representing 25% of the grant) to the Messy Play Group to purchase equipment.
